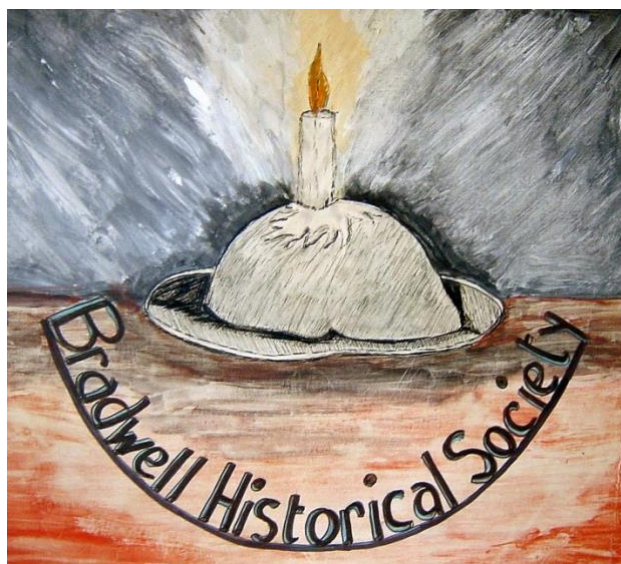


Bradwell in two World Wars

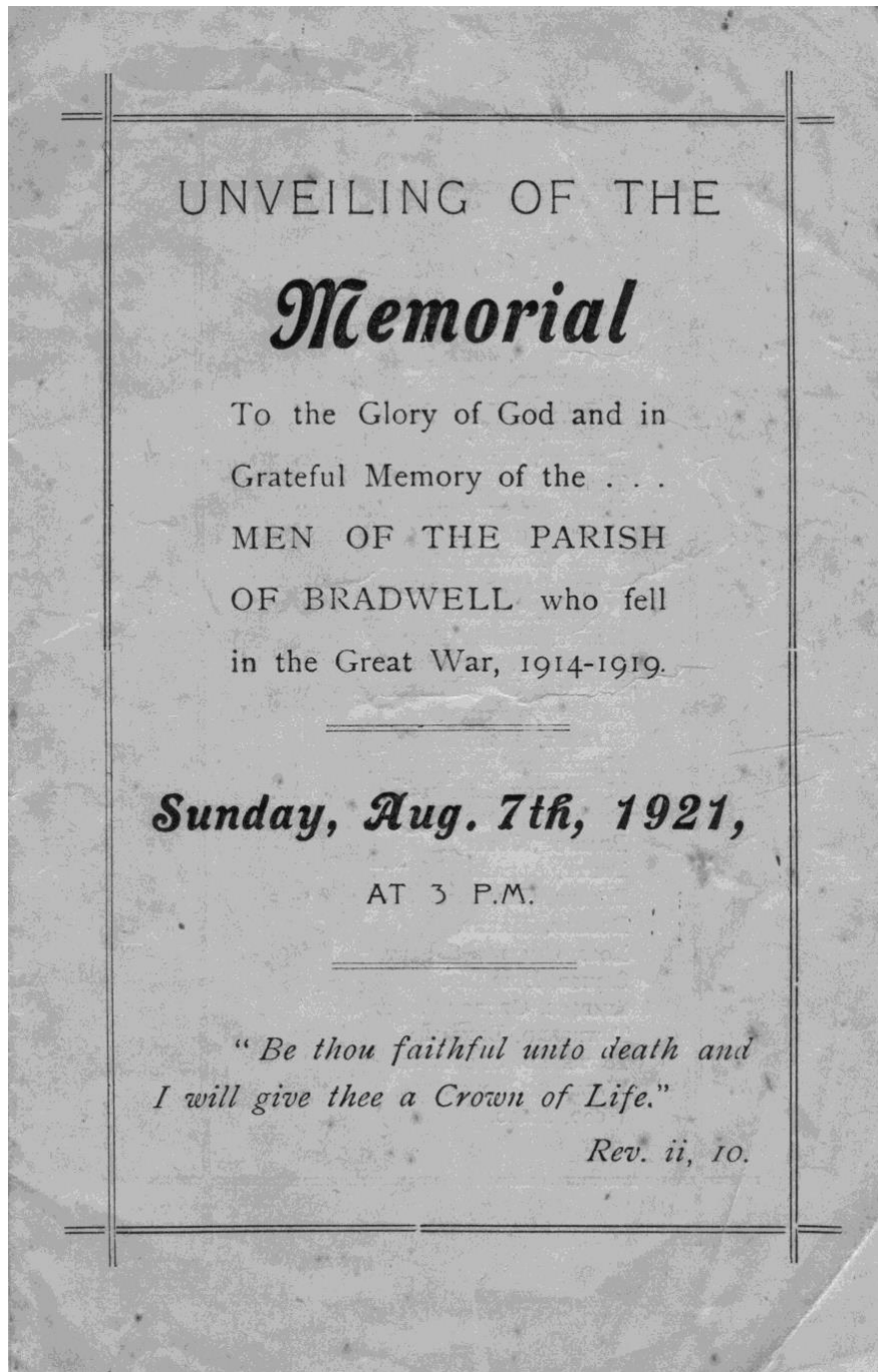

On a wet Sunday in August 1921 the people of Bradwell safely under their umbrellas assembled to witness Colonel Herbert Brook Taylor unveil the Cenotaph in the church yard in front of St Barnabas. Sadly the 31 names those who had died inscribed on the Hopton-Wood stone of the memorial had to be increased by two as the full extent of the toll of World War I became known and now it seems that three more names might have been added. Later following World War II the names of six further men were added to Cenotaph and now it seems a further name might also have been added.

In 1918 local poet Isaac Middleton Hall wrote the poem 'God Bless Our Lads Today'

Father as we gather on this our Festal Day
Our hearts go out with longing, to loved ones far away:
Our homes are lonely, hearts are sad, o hear us as we pray
For dear ones now in peril – God bless our lads today.

We think of happy seasons when they were by our side,
But now strange skies spread over them and rolling seas divide;
The Mother's heart cries out to Thee, the little children pray
For dear ones now in danger – God bless our lads today.

What would we give, O Father, to clasp their hands once more
To see their smiling faces and know that strife was o'er
Now we can only love and pray for they are far away.
But Thou canst bless and shield them - God bless our lads today.

We know this very moment their hearts do yearn and long
To meet once more with loved ones and hear the children's song
O Father, may Thine angels bear our songs to them, we pray,
And may it cheer and comfort – and bless our lads today.

And some, alas, have fallen, their dream of home is o'er,
And bitter tears are falling for those who'll come no more.
O mourner, they are safe with God, safe in our Father's care
They're waiting in the homeland – there'll be no parting there.

O Father, lift the darkness that clouds the land we love
And to the bleeding nations send forth Thy heavenly dove
O guard us safely through the night, bid cruel wars to cease
And Father, in Thy mercy, grant an abiding peace.

Colonel Herbert Brooke Taylor himself knew the pain of loss in the Great War as they called it because his son Lieutenant Arthur Cuthbert Brooke Taylor 6th Battn. The Manchester Regiment lost his life in action aged 27 on 4 June 1915. He is commemorated on the Helles Memorial, Gallipoli, Turkey as are George Simpson and Raymond Evans.

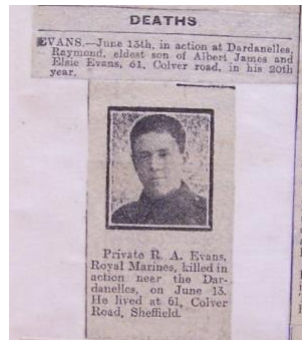

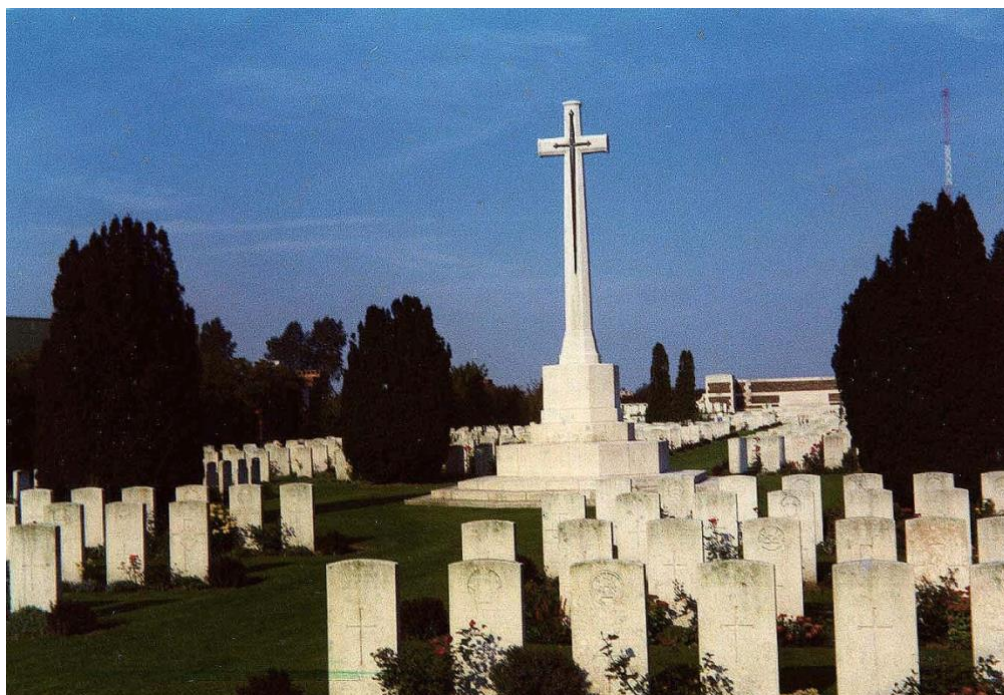

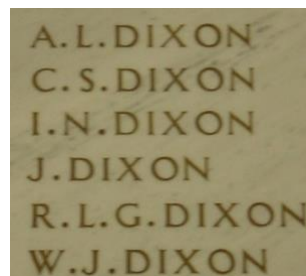

After the end of the war in Europe Frank remained as an army volunteer, posted to East Africa and was commanding men of the KAR when the platoon mutinied and murdered him. He was then in Jubaland (now Southern Somalia).

Son of the Rev. Charles and Mrs. Katie Dawson-Smith, of Nash Rectory, Stony Stratford, Bucks, England; husband of Lavinia Dawson-Smith (née Dakin) of Netherside, Bradwell. Before the war Frank was a schoolmaster at Derwent House School, Bamford.

THE MYSTERY OF NORMAN BRADWELL

The name of Norman Bradwell appears on the Cenotaph as one of the war dead but initially it proved difficult to find a record of his death in the war. William Norman Bradwell, the son of William Bradwell of Hugh Lane, is mentioned several times in newspaper cuttings for the war years where he is referred to a Trooper Norman Bradwell. Trooper Norman Bradwell was a regular soldier having joined the Cheshire Regiment in about 1894. At the end of his initial service he joined the 17th Lancers in 1898 fought in the Boer Wars and signed re-engagement papers in 1910 as a reservist. By this time he had married Margaret Ann Mathieson of Leith in Scotland and they had three children. As a reservist Norman Bradwell was recalled to active service at the outbreak of WWI when he was with the 2nd Life Guards. He was taken prisoner of war in October 1914 and was held in Germany until November 1918. During his captivity he wrote several letters home to Bradwell. On his release in late 1918 he returned to his regiment and was re-united with his wife and their fourth child Catherine was born in September 1919. But Norman Bradwell was discharged from the army at Canterbury on 20th January 1920 as being physically unfit. He died 4 months later on 14th May at home in Leith, Midlothian, Scotland. The official cause of death was stated to have been cerebral haemorrhage due to a previous war injury. A brief report in the Derbyshire Courier suggested the injury occurred when he was a POW in Germany and he hit about the head with a stick. Perhaps because his death occurred so long after the end of the war (although apparently war-related) Norman's name is missing from the Commonwealth War Graves Commission's list of the dead of the First World War. His name, however was inscribed on the Bradwell War Memorial.
