13. THE Parish Church.

Dedicated to Saint Barnabas.
Consecrated October 22nd 1868. Consists of Nave,
Chancel and Vestry. Porch and Tower on South
side added in 1888. Open benches in the Nave,
seating about 200 people. Church lighted by tall
narrow windows, of which there 9 in the Nave,
2 in West wall, and 2 in the Chancel. The East
Window is stained and has three lights * One of the
South windows in the Nave is stained. There are 2
windows in the Vestry.
The Chancel is seated by oak stalls: there are also
in the Sanctuary three Sedilia and a Bishop's
Chair.
There is one Bell in the Tower, and one bell in the
open turret between the Nave and Chancel Roof.
The Church was gazetted as the Parish Church of Bradwell
in 1875. The Clock in the Tower was presented in the
year 1888, or thereabouts, through Mr. Edward Wares of Mallock.

* This window is dedicated to the memory of William
James Webb, the first Vicar of the Parish.
There is an Iron Safe in the Vestry for Registers, &c.

The Altar, with its re-table, covered by red velvet embroidered in the front. Has four Frontals. The ornaments on the re-table are, Brass Cross, two brass Candlesticks, and two Flower Vases. The back of the Altar is draped by green velvet hangings with blue embroidered orphreys.

There is a fair linen cloth for celebrations. There are all needful small Communion cloths of linen, with an embroidered silk kil and Burse.

The Holy Communion vessels are, Silver Flagon, Chalice, and Paten, given in 1868 by the Vicar of Hope and his wife. There are also two glass cruets.

The office Book for the celebrant has a carked oak desk.

There is a candle stand of three lights on either side of the Altar.

Other Furniture :-

Organ in chancel, presented by Sir William Jackson in 1869.

Brass Eagle Sestern, placed in the Church in 1899.

Oak Sestern Desk, placed in the Church in 1907.

Carked oak Pulpit and low Chancel screen, presented to the Church by Rev. R. B. Somerset.

The Font is of gray stone, and is octagonal in shape.

There is a mural Tablet in the north wall of the Sanctuary erected to the memory of the Rev. R. B. Somerset dated 1891.

The Baptismal Register dates from 1868, the Burial Register from 1869, and the Marriage Register from 1875.

The area of the Churchyard is stated as
Six Roods and twenty Perches in the
two Conveyance Deeds, copies of which are in
the Vestry safe and are dated 1866 and 1868.
The yard is surrounded by stone fences in good
condition. The upper portion of the south fence belongs
to Tennant's Brewery Company.

1. Lyubome's Charity, amounting to about £3
yearly, is given to the Vicar of this Parish,
through the Vicar of Hope, for distribution in
flannel and garments to about 20 persons
on the Festival of St. Thomas.
2. Marshall's Charity allows thirty shillings yearly
to the manager of the Church Day School
for distribution in prizes to the scholars.
